Bavarian Archive for Speech Signals (BAS), LMU München Terms of Usage of BAS Resources

- 1. Copies of BAS resources (only latest versions) can be obtained via the BAS. To use a BAS resource a user license has to be purchased by the user. This is also true for cost-free BAS resources; in this case the download of the resource implies the purchase of a BAS user license.
- 2. The user license authorises the user to exploit the resource for scientific and/or commercial purposes (depending on the type of license). The user license also grants the user the right to obtain additional copies and/or published updates for that resource from the BAS (distribution fees may apply).
- 3.1. The transfer of the resource and parts of it to third parties is prohibited. The same applies to modified versions, versions with lower quality or different formats that can be used to replicate the original resource.
- 3.2. The transfer of derived data to third parties is permitted, if the data do not allow the reengineering of the speech signal, e.g. trained models, feature vectors etc.
- 3.3. Parts (max. 50%) of single recordings may be played back publicly (e.g. on conferences, demo sessions) and distributed as examples to third parties.
- 4.1. All copyrights stay with the BAS or with the copyright holder of the resource as stated in the documentation of the resource.
- 4.2. The user must use a proper reference to the BAS resource in public presentations, talks or publications, either by citing a publication listed in the BAS resource's documentation or by reference to the handle PID of the BAS resource (the handle PID can be found in the CMDI metadata record or on the BAS repository/catalogue pages). Excempt of this obligations are commercial product developments when the product development must be protected against illegal re-engineering etc.
- 5. The user agrees to protect the privacy of the recorded speakers of the resource and to avoid any non-ethical usage of the signal or meta data.
- 6. Disclaimer: the use of the speech resources and their metadata is at own risk. All data are provided on an "as is" basis. The BAS expressively disclaims all warranties of any kind. Limitation of liability: the BAS will not be liable for any damages resulting from the use of the speech resources and their metadata.
- 7. By purchasing the speech corpus and the associated user license the user agrees to all the terms as stated above.
